

HOW TO OPEN THE TEMPLATE FILE

PDF format - you can open it in Photoshop, GIMP (Free), Illustrator, Corel Draw, AND Canva (guide below on how to use it in canva).

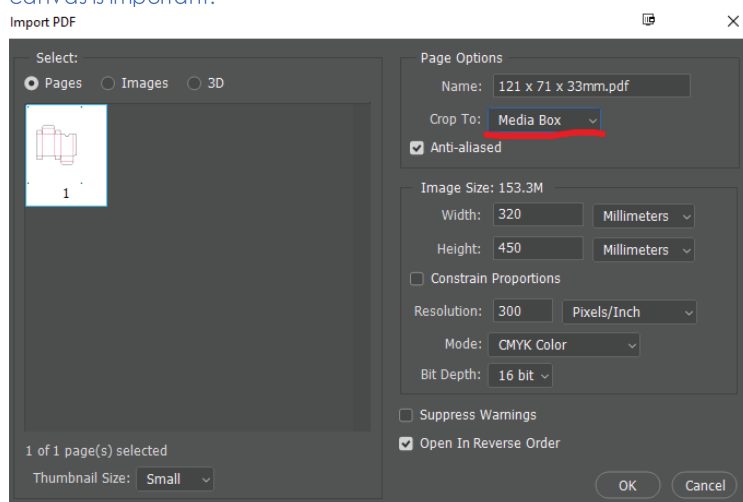
!!! **IMPORTANT !!** Please make sure to supply with **no cut lines (pink or black lines)** in PDF format. These lines will print on if you do not remove them. Delete the whole template layer if you have to. We do not need them and we overlay the template to verify as part of pre-press.



Opening the Template with Photoshop.

Open the file directly through Photoshop or right click on the pdf and select open with > Adobe Photoshop.

!! IMPORTANT !! Set the crop box to media box in page options and make sure all other options are set as in the image below. Do not create your own canvas and place the template in. The location of the box and size of the canvas is important.



Opening the Template with Illustrator

Open the file directly through Illustrator or right click on the pdf and select open with > Adobe Illustrator

It is *very* easy to do and is a bit of a secret it seems:
